

VISITOR SAFETY GUIDELINES

Welcome to our community! Our residents enjoy staying connected with family and friends. Safety is our focus, and as a precaution and to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in our community, we have created this resource for you. We ask that you review this information to help us keep everyone safe. If you have any questions or concerns during your visit, please contact the front desk and we will be happy to assist you.

Screenings

Everyone visiting the community will participate in our health screening before entry. Screening involves answering various questions and taking your temperature. Anyone with a temperature 100 degrees Fahrenheit or above will not be allowed to enter.

Wear a mask

Everyone entering our community must wear a mask. Masks are available at the front desk if you do not have one with you.

Hand hygiene

Hand sanitizer stations are placed throughout the community. **Please use hand sanitizer regularly throughout your visit and whenever you touch objects** such as doorknobs and elevator buttons. You should use hand sanitizer as you enter a resident's apartment and when leaving a resident's apartment.

Limit surface touching

As you make your way through our community, we ask that you avoid touching things as much as possible. If available, use a clean tissue or napkin to operate doorknobs and push elevator buttons. If you do touch any surfaces, please use hand sanitizer. Avoid touching your face at all times.

Limit physical contact & movement

During your visit, we ask that you please **limit your physical contact to just the resident you are visiting.** Our staff will direct you to your designated meeting area or apartment, and we ask that you stay in that area for the duration of your visit until you depart.

Monitor yourself for symptoms

Please refrain from visiting if you have cold or flu symptoms. You should **monitor yourself for the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 after your visit** to our community. If you experience symptoms, you should self-isolate in your home, contact your own health care provider, and notify us immediately.
